Introduction

Over the past few years I have increasingly been burdened for those around me who make decisions based on their current emotional state or the circumstances that are currently going on around them. Many people make important decisions every day based on what they feel is right or what they are being pressured to do at that moment. Based on a biblical truth found in Isaiah 28:9-10, my goal in these few short lessons is to help all of us learn Biblical truths based on scripture, and then to make decisions based on those truths. When adversity, trials and storms come into our lives, we will then have already made decisions that we can go back to and make choices in our lives based on those decisions and not on the emotion or the circumstance of the time.

For example, many people make a decision about their eternal salvation based on their current situation and feelings; however, God desires us to know that we are saved so then when satan comes to tempt our minds away from truth, we can say with confidence "I am a child of God and possess eternal life!"

It is impossible for us to learn every biblical truth found in God's word in these lessons, but my goal is that we would learn some very important truths, some principles and a method of decision making that will affect every aspect of our lives and help us learn more Biblical truths on our own.

To get the most out of these lessons, look up the scripture references and fill in the actual word(s) from the Bible. There are also some questions that will ask you to give an opinion or thought about the lesson. All references in these lessons will use the King James Bible. Do not hesitate to use the index in the front of your Bible if you have difficulty finding the passages.

Each lesson will be made up of three major components:

- 1. A Biblical Truth with a short study on that truth
- 2. A Verse to point us to that Truth try to memorize this verse
- 3. A place for you to write down any decision or thought you may have

Before you start each lesson, pray for God to show you truth from His Word and for Him to help you learn to apply that truth to your life!

#1 The Old & The New

❖ The Biblical Truth:

Today we all live under God's New Covenant

❖ A verse to point us to that truth:

Hebrews 8:13 In that he saith, A new covenant, he hath made the first old. Now that which decayeth and waxeth old is ready to vanish away.

- ➤ Our understanding of the Bible can lead us to read it with a grace perspective, a law perspective, or a combination of the two. That is why it is very important when we read our Bible to know that it is divided into a 'New Testament' and an 'Old Testament' and what section we are reading. If you want to truly understand the Bible, a good starting place is to know what this truth means.
- ➤ The division between the Old and New Testaments greatly affects how we understand the Bible. These two testaments (or covenants) show a major shift in how God relates to man. We do not live under the Old Testament (Covenant) we live under the New Testament (Covenant).
- ➤ The Old Testament was a covenant that God made with the nation of Israel. It was His agreement with the Jewish nation about the relationship that they had together.

Leviticus 26:46 These are the statutes and judgments and laws, which the
LORD made between him and the children of
in mount Sinai by the hand of Moses.
Psalms 147:19-20 He sheweth his word unto Jacob, his statutes and his
judgments unto He hath dealt so
with any nation: and as for his judgments, they have
known them. Praise ye the LORD.
➤ This means that the Gentiles - anyone who was not a Jew - were not part
of the Old Covenant. We were never meant to live under the law. Keep this
in mind as you read God's Word - the entire Bible was written for you, but
not all of it was written to you!
Romans 2:14 For when the Gentiles, which have the law,
do by nature the things contained in the law, these, having
the law, are a law unto themselves:
> To understand it correctly, the Old Testament (Covenant) did not actually
have anything to do with the laws of Moses. God gave the laws of Moses to
the Nation of Israel a little over 430 years after He made His Covenant with
them through Abraham. God knew that they would not be able to live up to
those Laws that He gave them. Although God knew they would not keep
the law, the Nation of Israel thought they could! This was a show of their
own self-righteousness.

> We need to make a distinction between these two Covenants - the

to understand that they cannot be mixed. When the time was right, God set
the Old Testament aside and completely declared it 'faulty'.

➤ The New Testament (Covenant) is not like the old one. It is completely

- ➤ If we fail to make the distinction between the Old and the New Covenants, we will become conflicted and confused when we read the Bible. It is critical, if we want to avoid confusion, to make the distinction between the New and Old Testaments.
- ➤ Many people would say that the New Testament begins with Matthew, because that is where the division is made in their Bible the Old Testament ends with the book of Malachi and the New Testament begins with Matthew. However, this is not where God divided the Covenants.

- ➤ God could not have left the Old Covenant in place because when it comes to knowing Him, experiencing Him, and pleasing Him, it has nothing to do with our efforts to behave. Instead, it has everything to do with His grace that allows us to have life and life abundantly.
- A challenge to you would be to read the New Testament with new eyes. Begin to read it through both a lens of Grace under the New Covenant and also with an understanding that everything that was said before Christ went to the cross and died for you was under the Old Covenant.

#2 Jesus is God

❖ The Biblical Truth:

Jesus is God in the Flesh and came to fulfill God's Plan

- **❖** A verse to point us to that truth:
 - 1 Timothy 3:16 And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.
- ➤ In this lesson, the goal will be to see that Christ is God. Christ is the sum of all Christianity, and He is the center of all that is God. True biblical Christianity is not a religion, a system of beliefs, or a church. It is about a Person Jesus Christ.
- > Jesus was the perfect man. Jesus was hungry, tired, and experienced agony just like you and me.

Hebrews 4:15 For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in ______ points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.

> Jesus was also the perfect God.

➤ Jesus was always a part of God's Eternal Redemptive Plan. He knew that mankind would choose death over life, choose darkness over light, and choose themselves over Him. He also knew that because of this choice mankind would not be able to be righteous enough to live with Him in Heaven without Him providing a failsafe plan. He would have to be that plan.

#3 God's Plan

❖ The Biblical Truth:

God's plan is to give us eternal life through Jesus Christ

- **❖** A verse to point us to that truth:
 - 1 John 5:11 And this is the record, that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son.
- ➤ God desires us to have faith in Him and trust His Eternal Redemptive Plan. That by no means obligates God to do what we want. We only tend to see things from our own perspective and with our limited knowledge, but He is eternal -- no beginning and no ending.
- ➤ He is the real Father time, the creator of time. God is Triune, and each 'person' of the Godhead is eternal. He is Omniscient and fully conscious of each element of time without lack of clarity. He is Omnipotent -- all powerful -- operating outside of time. And, in the clearest sense, He is Omnipresent everywhere at the same time. He is fully interacting with all elements of time and space. He is 100% unique in every part of His being! He is holy! He never began to exist, He cannot stop existing, and He depends on nothing but Himself to exist. He does not change -- from eternity past to eternity future -- He is still the same!

This would also be true about His mercy and His grace.

➤ God is everlasting and has all power, and we will grow weary and we will faint as we try to attain everlasting life in our own strength and in our own efforts. It will never happen. But through Him, through His efforts and His power, we can obtain everlasting life!
➤ This thought is completely contrary to man's thoughts and ideas. Mankind wants to have some type of effort that they can accomplish to gain everlasting life so that they can say "Look at what I have done! I am good!" This is man's plan.
> But God has His own plan – His Eternal Redemptive Plan.

- ➤ God has a perfect Eternal Redemptive Plan and that is exactly what 1 Peter 1:18-23 is all about. We serve an omniscient God, who does not see eternity through a flawed perspective like ours, but who sees all of eternity as if it were all right now. All of this mess we are in has not surprised Him.
- ➤ He knew before time that man would sin and come short of His glory. He knew there would be a need for a plan even before the earth was formed. God foreknew that man would choose sin and that the wages (consequences) for that horrible choice would be death.
- ➤ You see, God's righteousness must be met somehow. If man died in his sin, it would be eternally too late. What would He do? But God had a plan for mankind to be redeemed and He would do it for you!
- ➤ Here is God's Eternal Redemptive Plan. He would save man through faith in the coming Messiah through the Sacrificial System in the Old Testament times.

- ➤ Because He loved us so much He decided to take our sin upon Himself and to bear the shame, the reproach, the wrath, and the justice on our behalf. God would redeem the world through Christ, and He planned this before you and I committed our first sin! The everlasting God has an everlasting plan for redemption for all of the world. It is a plan that you can believe in, it is a plan you can trust and it is a plan you can put your whole faith behind.
- ➤ This is the question that is before all of mankind and the same question that is put before you today: Do you want to follow God's Eternal Redemptive Plan to gain everlasting life with God in Heaven? Or do you want to follow your own flawed plan that leads to death, separated from God?

#4 Salvation

❖ The Biblical Truth:

Salvation is given freely to those who believe in God and His Eternal Redemptive Plan

❖ A verse to point us to that truth:

Romans 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

➤ For thousands of years mankind has asked this important question: "If God is real and He requires me to be saved, 'what must I do to be saved?'" (Acts 16:30) God wants us to be clear about this answer. He told us the answer in the very next verse.

Acts 16:31 And they said, ______ on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved...

➤ Paul sums up God's Eternal Redemptive Plan for mankind's salvation when he says that it is by God's grace. The word grace has various meanings, but as it relates to salvation it speaks of kindness bestowed on one who does not deserve it. In other words, grace pours favor on those who do not deserve favor. In God's grace the question is not whether or not a person deserves favor or blessing, but only whether God desires to give it.

- Although God's grace is freely given and seen, grace can only affect you personally when you exercise faith in Jesus Christ. This brings up a very practical question "What is meant by faith?" Faith is a belief in something, and then trusting in that belief. According to James 2:19, "... the devils also believe, and tremble..." The devils believe in Christ but do not put their trust in His work on the cross for their own salvation.
- ➤ This is what is meant in Romans 10:9 when it says "... shalt believe in thine heart ..." This is trust and belief -- faith!

Romans 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt ______ in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou ______ be saved.

➤ Salvation is not in someone doing good things, belonging to a church, getting baptized, or having their sins forgiven. It is about life. Before we believe in God's Eternal Redemptive Plan, we are dead -- though Christ has redeemed the world, without faith (believe and trust) we cannot receive life!

➤ You have already looked at God's Eternal Redemptive Plan in an earlier lesson. Remember, God does not force His plan on you. He allows each and every person to decide for themselves if they want to choose His plan or choose their own plan. The problem with our plan is that our plan will not take us to heaven, give us eternal life, or allow us to be with God for all of eternity. God will not force you to believe His plan, but since He created us all, He gets to decide what that plan is and what happens when you do not follow His plan.

- ➤ Satan tries to get us to doubt our salvation. He tries to get us to question if we are even a Christian or not. When you slip up and sin, he will try to get you to forget who you are and what God has done inside of you!

#6 Your Identity

❖ The Biblical Truth:

God has created a new creature in you

- **❖** A verse to point us to that truth:
 - 2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
- ➤ One of the most asked questions I have received is "Who am I? What is my identity in this world?" It seems like a basic question. Many may quickly answer with a list of titles to cover the truth that they may not really know who they are. They may answer something like this: Father, Mother, son, daughter, boss, employer, nurse, waiter, secretary, or Grandparent. But these are labels about what we do and our position in life. But does it really answer who we are?
- ➤ Sadly, many Christians have absolutely no confidence or even knowledge of who they are.
- The Holy -- completely unique -- God had a plan for mankind to be redeemed before He even created the world. Part of God's Eternal Redemptive Plan is: at the moment we believe and trust in His Plan we receive Life (salvation) and He creates a new creature in us. He exchanges our old nature for a new nature and comes and lives in us!

➤ Who we are in Christ needs to be a part of our core value system! It ought
to be a fundamental teaching in our Churches and in our homes. When a
child who has been saved for a while is asked "Who are you?", the first
answer off of their head should be "A child of the King of kings!" The
opposite is usually taught - who we are is based on what we do, and if we
don't do right then who we are is flawed!
> Who we are is not a mystery. God tells us and desires us to believe His
Word about who we are!
2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a
creature: old things are away; behold,

➤ He literally made a new creation in us!
The interarry made a new creation in us:

➤ As Paul said, "the old is gone".

#7 Christ's Church

❖ The Biblical Truth:

Christ loved the Church so much that He died for it

❖ A verse to point us to that truth:

Ephesians 5:25 Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;

- ➤ The concept of 'Church' has been a confusing one for many throughout time. Some have said it is a building -- but Christ would not have died for a building; some have said it was a system of beliefs (religion) -- but Christ would not have died for a system of beliefs; and some have said it is a denomination -- but Christ would not have died for a denomination formed by man.
- ➤ Christ died for the Church and that Church is a living, breathing, moving, serving, praising, worshipping organism made up of believers who community together for His glory! If you are a believer in Christ, He desires for you to love the same thing He loves -- He desires for you to gather together with other believers for the purpose of worshiping, praising, learning, serving, teaching and reaching.
- ➤ The word Church (or Churches) is found 114 times in the New Testament. The word *Church* comes from the English word meaning the same as the Greek word *ekklesia* which is defined as 'an assembly' or 'called-out ones'.
- ➤ Ekklesia is the root word of the words 'ecclesiology' and 'ecclesiastical'.

- ➤ Paul refers to the church in their house -- not a building, but a body of believers meeting together.
- ➤ The church is the body of Christ, of which He is the head.

Ephesians 1:22-23 And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the ______, Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all.

- ➤ The body of Christ -- The Church -- is comprised of two aspects:
 - 1) The Institution of the Church. Some may call this the *universal church*. This would consist of all those who have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. This verse says that anyone who believes is part of the body of Christ. A way to understand this would be to think about Marriage and School -- the institution of marriage consists of all those who are married (though not everyone is married to everyone else who is married) and the institution of school consists of all of those who go to school (though not everyone who goes to school attends the same school as everyone else). If we understand the original word of *ekklesia* we would see the term 'assembly'. It would be impossible for all believers to assemble at one place at one time now. One day we will be gathered together in one place -- before the throne of God!

2) The local Church -- An assembly of believers in a particular city that gather together for a purpose to glorify God, praise God, worship God, and serve God together.

➤ Here we see that in the province of Galatia there were many churches — what we call local churches. A local body of believers. All of those who are believers in Christ and in God's Eternal Redemptive Plan should seek fellowship in a local church. The local church is where believers can fully apply the 'body' principles of 1 Corinthians chapter 12 — encouraging, teaching, and building one another up in the knowledge and grace of the Lord Jesus Christ.

#8 Baptism

❖ The Biblical Truth:

Water Baptism by immersion is the Biblical way for Baptism

❖ A verse to point us to that truth:

Acts 8:38 And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him.

- ➤ Many religions have different ideas about what baptism is and what baptism is not. Some believe baptism accomplishes the washing away of sin. Others consider baptism a form of exorcism from evil spirits. Still others teach that baptism is a step of obedience -- an acknowledgment of salvation. But are any of these right? One word that could be given for the meaning of baptism would be identification.
- ➤ Baptism speaks primarily of a personal, public identification with Jesus Christ.

Romans 6:3-4 Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized
Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we
are buried with him by baptism death: that like as
Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we
also should walk in newness of life.

- ➤ Notice the strength of the expressions—"baptized into Jesus Christ" and "baptized into his death" and "buried with him by baptism." Someone might say that the primary meaning here is talking about Spirit baptism and that would be true, but water baptism is clearly in the background of this passage when talking about identity.
- ➤ How important is baptism? It is our personal identification with the greatest act of human history -- the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Identification!
- Baptism does not save you.

Ephesians 2:8-9 For by grace are ye saved through ______; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: ______ of works, lest any man should boast.

➤ Baptism is our personal testimony of our passage from the old life to the new life in Christ. Baptism means we are publicly identifying with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. When you are baptized, you are visually preaching the gospel -- a sermon without using any words. As you are lowered into the water, you symbolize Jesus being buried in the tomb, and as you are raised from the water, you symbolize Jesus rising from the dead. By your baptism you are saying, "When I believed in God's redemptive plan for my eternal life, I died with Jesus Christ, I was buried with him, and now I am raised with Christ."

- ➤ The process of baptism is simple. Another believer (one who has been recommended by your local church) lowers you under the water and then brings you back up out of the water. Literally you are 'immersed' in water. Some religions sprinkle water on people instead of immersing them, but is this okay? Nowhere in the Bible does anything but 'immersion' take place during a baptism. Baptism is always by immersion.
- This makes sense if you understand that *baptize* is a transliteration of the original Greek word *baptizw* (baptizo). *Baptizo* comes from the root word *baptw* (bapto), a term used for immersing a garment into dye -- changing the color of the cloth. When you process cloth to change its color, you are said to *baptize* it.
- ➤ When looking in the New Testament we see some interesting facts about baptism:
 - Baptism needed water Matthew 3:11
 - Baptism needed plenty of water John 3:30
 - Baptism was going down into the water Acts 8:30
 - Baptism was also coming up out of the water Matthew 3:16, Acts
 8:39
 - We also see the Apostle Paul call baptism a "burial" in Romans 6:4 and Colossians 2:12.
- ➤ The early church always 'immersed' when baptizing.
- ➤ A new believer in Jesus Christ should desire to be baptized as soon as possible.

➤ Phillip asked him if he believed all that he had taught him about Christ,						
and the eunuch said, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." Right						
away, they stopped the chariot, and Philip baptized the man.						

> We should not be ashamed -- or afraid -- to tell the world what Christ has

done for us. One easy way is baptism.

#9 How Are We To Live?

❖ The Biblical Truth:

We are to live in Christ and live life abundantly!

❖ A verse to point us to that truth:

John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

- ➤ How can we look like Christ, show Christ to others, do things that please Him and still keep messing up in our everyday life? And how do we do those things without feeling like we are back on the treadmill of work and guilt?
- ➤ We are taught from God's Word that there are things that can happen and things that cannot happen:

We cannot

- Be separated from God's love Romans 8:35-39
- Be lost or perish John 10:28 and John 3:16
- Be taken out of my Father's hand John 10:29
- Be charged or accused Romans 8:33
- Be condemned 1 Corinthians 11:32

We can

- Do all things through Christ Philippians 4:13
- Find mercy and grace to help Hebrews 4:16
- Come boldly to the throne of grace Hebrews 4:16
- Quench all the fiery darts Ephesians 6:16
- Declare liberty to captives Isaiah 61:1
- Pray always and everywhere Luke 21:36
- Defeat and overcome the enemy Revelation 12:11
- ➤ In spite of these things that can and cannot happen, every one of us still has obligations and responsibilities -- these are completely separate from having to follow 'laws' or 'rules'.
- ➤ Think of it this way: as an employer, an employee, a parent, or a student, there are things we must do even if we do not like it or do not want to do it. These are our obligations and responsibilities. Employers must pay their employees, pay taxes, and provide health insurance. Employees must work, show up on time, and follow the work's rules to keep the job. Parents must protect their children, provide for them, teach them what they need to know for life, and show them that they are loved. Students must do their homework, study, respect their teachers and leaders in the school, and respect the other students.

- ➤ No one has a problem with these and other obligations and responsibilities that are enacted on them, but as soon as a Church leader begins to lay out obligations or responsibilities for members of God's local Church, they are called out to be 'legalists'. This is not what legalism is. This is simply teaching how to walk in Christ and how that will show out to the world. Legalism is demanding you to do things for salvation or so you can receive blessings or favors from God or from the Pastor or the local Church.
- ➤ There are natural rewards and natural consequences to those who choose not to fulfill their responsibilities and to those who fulfill their responsibilities.
- ➤ The New Testament writings are designed to show us how to solve conflict with others, how to solve conflict with ourselves, and how to solve conflict with God. The solution to all of these is Christ! The New Testament also lays out for us what our life will look like when we allow Christ to live in and through us.

Philippians 1:20-21 According to my earnest expectation and my hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but that with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ shall be ______ in my body, whether it be by life, or by death. For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.

This is the portrait that God paints for us. Not a portrait of how to behave,

➤ This is the portrait that God paints for us. Not a portrait of how to behave, but how our life will look when we allow Christ to reign and live in our lives. God never intended for us to live alone or to be perfect. At salvation, He put His Spirit within us and came and dwelled in us to give us Supernatural Life -- Himself!

➤ He desires for us to be victorious over the circumstances we face, but many times we make the mistake of asking God to help us through the circumstances rather than yielding to His Spirit that lives in us so that He can live in and through us in the middle of that circumstance. God tells us that we can and should expect to have Christ as our life and to also have His mind, His strength, His provisions, His peace and His joy.

- ➤ Have you ever said "I just can't get victory over this problem!", "Just keep praying and victory will come.", "Victory comes only after much hard work.", or "I lost the victory."? These are very common -- but incorrect -- statements about victory.
- ➤ God's Word has many true promises about victory, but victory is not achieving, winning, being on top of it, or something we have to do. Why are these not Victory? Because they direct us away from The One who is our Victory. We often work for victory instead of from Victory!

Galatians 5:1 Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath

us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.

➤ Walking in defeat is not that we do not have victory -- we have been set free and Christ's life is victorious in us -- but that we choose (consciously or subconsciously) not to claim our victory, and we continue to live as though we are still in bondage. This condition of our lives is called "walking after the flesh" instead of "walking in the Spirit"

- Every day wake up and know you are alive in Christ, and allow your flesh -- the old habits -- to yield to Him as He leads. As you ask God to walk and live in you, He will show you how to live through His Word, through preaching and teaching, through feeling peace as you live when all these line up.
- ➤ I used to believe God said I was bad because I did bad things and I thought my behavior made me distant from Him. Then I studied the Bible and I learned God tells me I was dead and I needed His life. As long as I believed I was distant from God because I did bad things, I thought I could just change my behavior. But God solved my 'distance' problem by making me close to Himself by the death and resurrection of Christ.

- ➤ Remember, not everyone's life will look the same, not everyone will be working on the same things, and not everyone has issues with the same things. Each person will be living their life as Christ is leading them, and you will be living your life as Christ is leading you.
- ➤ When your life is not showing Christ -- allowing Christ to show out -- the answer is not 'do more try harder be better'. The answer is Christ know Him more, trust him more, and immerse yourself in Him. The result will be: your life will show the character of Christ.

➤ Many have and will say, "a loving God would not send people to a horrible hell." But those who would say that do not really understand God's grace and love. God provided a way of salvation to all. It is not for a select few -- God's desire is for all to receive eternal life. Therefore God does not send people to hell, they choose it themselves. You have a choice to believe in God's Plan or to believe your own plan.

- ➤ What is unfair -- and so amazing at the same time -- is that Christ died to redeem the world and freely offers salvation to all -- even to those whom He knows will reject Him!
- ➤ Those who receive or believe God's Eternal Redemptive Plan will spend eternity with Him. Heaven cannot be explained completely, even by the Bible, because it is too wonderful for words and too indescribable to relate to by images.

- ➤ Many people think of us going to heaven and floating on a cloud and playing harps while chubby little cherub angels fly around us. This is nothing like the heaven that is described in the Bible.
- ➤ The Bible actually talks about three heavens. The first heaven is where the birds fly and the clouds reside. The second heaven is where the sun, the moon, and the stars abide. The third heaven is where the throne of God is and where Jesus presently sits at the right hand.
- ➤ Heaven is a real place and there are angels there who declare, "Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory" day in and day out!
- ➤ John describes what Heaven will eventually look like after God has finished judging those who did not believe His Plan.

Revelation 21:1-7 And I saw a new heaven and a new earth: for the first
heaven and the first earth were passed; and there was
no more sea. And I John saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down
from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And
I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is
with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and
God himself shall be with them, and be their God. And God shall wipe away
all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more,

➤ This is an immense city that some estimate to be about 1,300 square miles wide, 1,300 square miles long and 1,300 square miles high. The square footage is in the billions! This city has foundations, walls, gates, streets, and God as the temple.

Almighty and the Lamb the temple of it.					

➤ Our curiosity about where those who have passed away are, may not be completely satisfied by Bible verses. What we do know is that either eternal torment in hell or eternal joy in heaven awaits all people after the physical death. This destination is in their hands and is based on whether they trust in God's Eternal Redemptive Plan or reject it.

Angels and Demons are real

❖ A verse to point us to that truth:

Ephesians 6:12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

- Angels are spiritual beings who have intelligence, emotions, and a will. Angels are spirit beings without a physical body of their own. The word *angel* actually comes from the Greek word *aggelos*, which means *messenger*. Because they are created beings, they do not know all things as God does. They do have a greater knowledge than humans because angels have direct access to God and have observed human activities for years.
- God sends His angels to help believers

Hebrews 1:14 Are they not all ______ spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?

- ➤ We also see in the Bible where angels also:
 - Praise God Psalm 148:1-2
 - Worship God Revelation 5:8-13
 - Rejoice in what God does Job 38:6-7
 - Appear before God Job 1:6; 2:1

- Used by God as instruments of His judgments Revelation 7:1; 8:2
- Bring answers to prayer Acts 12:5-10
- Aid in winning people to Christ Acts 8:26; 10:3
- Encourage in times of danger Acts 27:23-24
- Care for the righteous at the time of death Luke 16:22
- Angels are an entirely different order of being than humans. Human beings do not become angels after they die. Angels will never become, and never were, human beings. God created the angels, just as He created man; however, we do not see in God's Word that He created angels in the image and likeness of Himself, as humans are. Angels are spiritual beings that can, to a certain degree, take on physical form.

➤ Demons are fallen angels

The demons who encountered Jesus knew who He was, and they feared Him.
